Bernard writes a girlfriend in the United States:

"March 29th [1945]

Back again old girl after another short move, this one I sure hope is the last. I am really getting tired of this setting up house keeping for only a short period. This time I am living in a cocanut grove rather than a rice patty and at least we have a little shade and occasionally a breeze...Now the time is begining to tell...and I just plug along from day to day. One of the boys that has already gone home once told me that after seven or eight months you just don't give a d _ m, and I must admit he was right. I am begining to wonder why we are liberating some of these d _ _ kies...Be good...and don't work to hard. I'll write you again in a few days.

Bernard writes the same girl again in the United States:

"June 18th [1945]

Recieved your letter yesterday and as always it was swell hearing from you...I knocked myself out yesterday building a floor in our tent. Before this time we were swamped with mud every time it rained and that wasn't to good. So between flying and trying to keep my home up I'm a busy boy. Still waiting for some defenite word on going home but these big shots always hold out. Makes me think that they are stalling this month off. If so I think that I can stand it because I would like my leave to go over into Aug...Gee Im getting anxious to get back and see you.
