Keith writes a friend in the United States:

"19 MAY 45 ...Germany

Now that the shooting is over I can get a chance to answer your letter of 28 Feb. & your V-mail job of 8 April.

We have it fairly easy now doing Military Government work & I've been appointed Summary Court Officer for this district & expect to start slapping H _ _ nies in the 'clink' starting Monday.

We are staying in a small hotel with beds & sheets & a bath & beer on tap – not bad!

...Got drunk for the first time in a good long while on V-E day on Dutch whiskey we captured from the J _ rr _ s who in turn took it from the Dutch – lousy stuff – but what the h _ _ !!

Fraternally, <u>Keith</u>."
