"Nov 15 1943

How are you all? Im fine as usual and hoping you are all the same. Sure will be glad to see everyone again. Admiral Husley says the war will be over by Christmas, well I sure hope so...

...Were having lots of excitement around here but I can't write about anything so I'll have to wait till I get home.

It's hard to get any time off to write letters now so Ill just write whenever, I get a spare minute or two.

Have you got my sea bag yet? Dont forget to let me know when you do and whats left in it.

Ive got to get to work now so so long until next letter

Love Byron"
