**John writes a soldier's wife in the United States between late 1942 and early 1943:**

“172<sup>nd</sup> Inf.  
A.P.O. 708  
c/o Postmaster  
San Francisco

Dear Mrs. Smith:

Your good husband Sgt. Smith has asked me to write to reassure you that he is safe and well, on this beautiful island somewhere in the Coral Sea. I am Chaplain X who arrived here recently with the 172<sup>nd</sup> Inf...I have been saying Mass for the 182<sup>nd</sup> and using your husbands tent for confessions. He has been wonderful to me and his good example has a powerful influence on the men under him. Honestly, I've never seen such Faith as these boys practice. They recite the rosary together every night and receive the sacraments every chance they have.

You can be sure the Good Lord and his Holy Mother will protect them and return them safely to their loved ones. Keep on praying and trust in God. With a wife like you the Sgt really has something to fight for so write often to encourage him and be assured he is very well –
