## Manuel, a Filipino American soldier, writes a friend in the United States:

"2nd July 44

Today is Sun. and another week and another month gone, but still floating along. All kinds of services going on deck and in the officers lounge...

...Not much to say except the fact that I feel fine. Sometimes I get the bunk fatigue but only temporary. Feel pretty filthy for a Sun. but didn't have to dress up at all for the service. Didn't even have to comb my hair as I don't have any left to fool with after my second super short haircut...

...Have you seen a horse fly? I haven't either but I have seen fish fly – thousands of them over the waves. And speaking of waves. I think I've seen enough for a life time. I mean ocean waves of course.

It's only one oclock and I'm hungry already – quite long before the second meal at five. So I'll go back to my bunk and sleep it out. Good day – be sure and keep the good health always...
